How many fingers does Professor Cahill have on his hand?

Tally: 1111

Arabic Numerals: 5 Roman Numerals: V

These are all different ways to write it, but all are symbols used to represent the same number.

We can change the numerals without changing $my\ number\ of\ fingers$

We most often use Arabic numerals

Where do we see Roman numerals?

Ex: Clocks and keeping track of Star Wars movies

As a warm up to using different numerals, let's look at Roman Numerals.

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How to represent Arabic numerals as Roman numerals:

1: I 5: V 10: X 50: L 100: C 500: D 1000: M

Rules for Roman numerals:

If two numerals are ordered higher to lower from left to right then add the numbers

Ex: XI = 11

If two numerals are ordered lower to higher from left to right then subtract the smaller number from the larger

Ex: IX = 9

Never write more than 3 of a number in a row

Ex: 3 = III but 4 = IV

Only subtract 1's from 5's and 10's; 10's from 50's and 100's; and 100's from 500's and 1000's

Ex: 40 = XL

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Examples:

Write the following Roman numerals as Arabic numerals:

XXVI = 26

XCIX = 99

CCXCV = 295

MCMI = 1901

Write the following Arabic numerals as Roman numerals:

7 = VII

14 = XIV

436 = CDXXXVI

2349 = MMCCCXLIX

Write your birthday year in Roman numerals: 1983 = MCMLXXXIII
